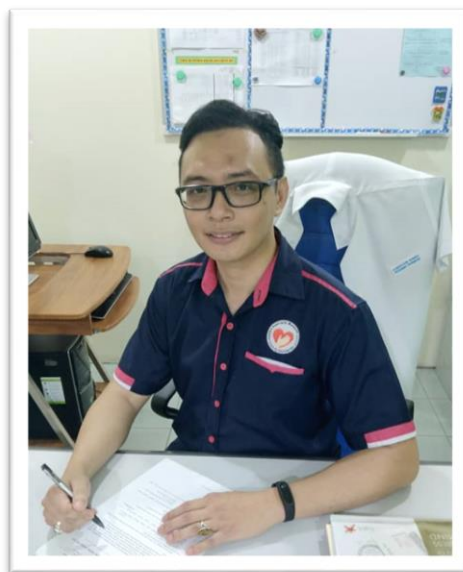


## ***Letter from the editor***
